MARKING OF IMPORTED GOODS

Referring to Memorandum Series D No. 1, Revised 1939, you are advised that paragraph (a) of the regulations under Section 20, relative to the marking of ladies' purses in the form of handbags, is hereby cancelled, and the following is substituted therefor:

(a) Ladies' purses, in the form of handbags, are required to be marked by means of die-stamping or rubber stamping, on the outside of the bag itself, on the metal frame or on the leather or fabric lining, provided that the combination of colours used in the stamping and on the bag does not result in an indistinct or illegible indication, or by means of a woven or printed label sewn or otherwise strongly attached (not gummed) to the inside of the bag. To be satisfactory, the indication in every case must be in a conspicuous position.
