#### INTRODUCTION

Harbour Publishing Company Fonds, 1972-1990

5.5 m.

The bulk of the Harbour Publishing Company fonds are the records of Harbour Publishing Company and Raincoast Chronicles, 1972-1990.

The Harbour Publishing Company fonds consist of the records of Raincoast Chronicles from its inception in 1972, through the incorporation of the Raincoast Historical Society in August 1973, to the incorporation of Harbour Publishing Company in 1984 up until the end of 1990. The Raincoast Chronicles was never incorporated. The Papers include correspondence, financial statements, manuscripts published and unpublished, publisher's catalogues, mailing lists and much miscellania from both Harbour Publishing Compnay and Raincoast Chronicles. The papers were accessioned by the Special Collections from Howard White in 1991.

#### BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Howard White was born in 1945 on the Sunshine Coast of Vancouver Island, British Columbia. Because he spent time with his father, Frank, who drove logging-rigs, Howard apparently commenced his formal schooling several years later than the norm. However this did not impede his scholastic progress; after graduating from high school, he undertook but did not complete a B.A. programme at the University of British Columbia. He left one course short of graduation.

Motivated by the concern that "B.C. Coast history was suffering from a double discrimination", White started the Raincoast Chronicles in 1972. His aim was to publish a periodical featuring works by and about the people of the coast stressing the culture and industry which formed their identity. The bulk of the works revolved around the logging and fishing industries of the island. Writers such as Hubert Evans, Peter Trower, Scott Lawrance and Patrick Lane, as well as Howard White himself, were early contributors.

In 1984, Harbour Publishing Company was incorporated. Since its inception, the company has continued to publish books by its original contributors. As well Harbour has published works by such diverse literary figures as Marie Putman with her Mentely Handicapped Love; Alan Twigg with his biographical study of Bill Van der Zalm, and his collection of biographies of Vancouver writers; and Edith Iglauer with her Seven Stones: A Portrait of Arthur Erickson, Architect. Numerous collections of poetry by both Westcoast and otherwise Canadian poets, such as Anne Cameron, Julia Moe, David Day, Kevin Roberts, Erin Moure, and more, have also been published by Harbour.

Howard White has this year, 1991, been awarded the Governor General's Leacock Award for Humour. Further to his publishing and writing career, Howard White is married to Mary White who has apparently been involved in his publishing ventures since their beginnings. The Whites have two sons, Silas and Patrick. Howard intends to stand as an N.D.P. candidate in the forhtcoming election. In the meantime he continues his literary activities.

#### SCOPE AND CONTENT

The Harbour Publishing Company Fonds

are contained in 44 boxes; six are legal sized (12.5 x 39); the remaining are letter size (12.5 x 31.5). Box No. 44 contains restricted material. The restriction on this material is to be lifted in the year 2011. The Famous Correspondence file (44-7) can be made public at anytime.

The Fapers consist of two major groups: The Harbour Publishing Company and The Raincoast Chronicles. However, for the most part, these two groups have been kept together in order to maintain the system as it appears to have been maintained by Howard White. There is, however, a separate series for Raincoast Chronicles which consists mainly of manuscripts. Within the general series, such as those of correspondence and fincancial, there is also Raincoast material. Much effort has been made to preserve the original order of the material although that order seems at times a trifle erratic.

The records in general include incoming and outgoing correspondence, financial records, manuscripts published and unpublished, Canada Council grant material, publishers catalogues and files, and miscellania.

The *Papers* are divided into eleven series, A-J and R. They are further divided in some cases into sub-series, which are identified numerically, as for example A.1. Occasionally, there is a further division which is identified by lower Roman numerals, as for example A.1.i. In the case of the published manuscript series, C, the sub-series is identified with CC.

The Published Authors Series has been arranged alphabetically according to the author's surname; the files, however, have been labelled numerically. In some cases where the author's name is unavailable, the file is labelled according to the title of the work. The original arrangement of the manuscripts and other material appears to have been somewhat erratic; this may be the original filing system or possibly simply a result of hurried packing. Consequently, the reconstruction of the files into series C and sub-series CC has been necessary. A specific reason for the separation is unclear at present. One can only speculate that a hierarchical order was instituted based, perhaps, on volume of published work.

The files contain, in general, manuscripts, proofs, and very occasionally the finished product in book form. Where dates are available, the work is arranged chronologically. Included also, in some cases, are reviews and author's correspondence with Howard White. Although there are correspondence files for author's (Specific Correspondence Series: A.4), the correspondence has been kept in the files in the order as found, in order to adhere more closely to Mr. White's system. Photos and miscellaneous other materials have also been kept in the files in the C and CC series for the same reason.

#### INTRODUCTION

Harbour Publishing Company fonds, 1980-1990

The bulk of the fonds consists of manuscripts submitted to Harbour Publishing Company and related material, 1980-1990.

Although Harbour Publishing Company was not incorporated until 1984, it was publishing prior to that time. The Raincoast Historical Society was incorporated in August, 1973. The Howard White Corporate fonds acquired in 1991 included both the records of Raincoast Chronicles and Harbour Publishing Company. This fonds relates mainly to the activities of Harbour Publishing Company in the 1980's; although there is some material prior to 1980 and a few items after 1990. In addition to published and unpublished manuscripts and correspondence related to them, the fonds consists of subject files pertaining to the Company's activities and a small amount of financial records, including early journals of the Raincoast Historical Society

#### BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

The Harbour Publishing Company was incorporated by Howard White in 1984. It continued the work that was started by the publishing of <u>Raincoast Chronicles</u> in 1972 by the Raincoast Historical Society. Howard White was the driving force behind the Chronicles that developed a popularity that could sustain the establishment of the Harbour Publishing Company.

Born in 1945 on the Sunshine Coast of British Columbia, Howard White spent his childhood and work history on the Sunshine Coast. Motivated by a concern that "B.C. Coast history was suffering from a double discrimination", White started Raincoast Chronicles in 1972. His aim was to publish a periodical featuring works by and about the people of the coast stressing the culture and industry which formed their identity. The bulk of the works revolved around the logging and fishing industries of the island.

This trend was followed by White with the creation of Harbour Publishing Company. Since it inception, the company has continued to publish books by its original contributors. The manuscripts listed in the inventory reflect the Company's policy. Howard White has continued to edit Raincoast Chronicles under Harbour Publishing. In addition he has edited several books such as Hard to Beat and Accidental Airline as well as publishing his own books of poetry and humour.

#### SCOPE AND CONTENT

The Harbour Publishing Company fonds consists mainly of manuscripts submitted to Harbour Publishing Company. The manuscript material has been arranged by author. Correspondence that was in manuscript files has been kept with the manuscript. The subject files, in most cases, do not contain manuscripts, only material about particular subjects.

Howard White had separated the material into the Harbour Publishing Company fonds and his personal fonds prior to donating it to the Library. That order was retained. There does seem to be an overlap between fonds of manuscripts of authors. Both fonds should be checked when looking for the manuscripts and correspondence relating to a writer.
