Vancouver Status of Women, 1971-

Papers, 1971-1978

The Vancouver Status of Women was officially incorporated in 1973. By this time they had changed their name but not their structure two times: the British Columbia Status of Women Action Co-ordinating Council (BCSWACC) then the British Columbia Status of Women Council (BCSWC). Therefore, the Vancouver Status of Women was actually established in 1971 under the name of BCSWACC.

BCSWACC was organized after a conference held in response to the Report of the Royal Commission on the Status of Women. This commission was set up by the federal government under Prime Minister Pearson in 1967. Its objective was to inquire into the status of women in Canada so as to ensure for women equal opportunities with men in all aspects of Canadian society.

The result of the conference was to set up an organization to press the federal and provincial governments for action on the Status of Women Report. The objectives:

1. to promote action on the Report of the Royal Commission in Canada;
2. to foster public knowledge of the rights and status of women in Canada;
3. to facilitate communication between individuals and groups concerned about the status of women.

The first permanent executive included women from the University Women's Club, church groups, political parties, an anti-poverty group, a union executive, professional women with varied experience, a college professor, a women's lib group and four different ethnic backgrounds-European, black, Chinese and Canadian antive Indian.

Many accomplishments have been gained both directly and indirectly through the Vancouver Status of Women since 1971. Matrimonial property laws have improved throughout the country and British Columbia was the first province to have pension benefits shared. There are many more examples.

Ironically, these papers were collected as a result of a loss of office space due to the cutting of core funding by the provincial government at the end of the 1984-85 fiscal year. Although the Secretary of State has taken over some of the financial responsibility of the Vancouver Status of Women, services have been cut back substantially.

Guide to the Inventory

The Vancouver Status of Women papers comprise a main body of office and research papers. Materials on the human rights act, family law and the like are included in these papers as they pertain to women in British Columbia and Canada. The Vancouver Status of Women has had two previous name changes, the British Columbia Status of Women Action Co-ordinating Council (BCSWACC) and the British Columbia Status of Women Council (BCSWC). There is one subgroup, the Women's Liberation Alliance.

All sub-series or files and the subgroup are in alphabetical order. At the end of the collection all unidentifiable files are labelled miscellaneous.

Therefore, it is to be stressed that except for the breakdown into subgroups and series much of the arrangement has merely been put into alphabetical order. Internal evidence would suggest that at the time the papers were being produced the pace was quite hectic and this supposition is reflected in the nature of the files. In addition, an earlier attempt was made at arrangement of the papers as well as possible rearrangement by individual researchers.

The addendum, beginning on page 32, follows the same series structure as the initial donation.
