Die Bezeichnung "Made in Austria" fuer Waren, die nach Kanada eingefuehrt werden und dem Bezeichnungszwang unterworfen sind, ist auch jetzt noch zulaessig. Da auch bisher bereits deutsche Waren mit dem Vermerk "Made in Bavaria" oder "Printed in Saxony" zugelassen gewesen sind, ist nicht anzunehmen, dass fuer Waren, die bisher mit der Bezeichnung "Made in Austria" bezeichnet waren, eine Aenderung zu erwarten ist. Ziffer 8 der "General Regulations Governing the Marking of Imported Goods" des Zollministeriums hat folgenden Wortlaut:

"The words "Made in," "Produced in," "Printed in," or other words of similar import, followed by either the name of the country or the name of the city and province, state or other division of a country in which that city is located and in which the goods referred to are produced, comprises a satisfactory indication of the country of origin. The name of a manufacturer or producer followed by the name of the country or a city or place and the province, state, or other division of the country

in which that city or place is located, and in which the goods so marked are made or produced, will also be accepted as satisfactory. In the case of universally known large cities, such as London, Liverpool, Manchester, Birmingham, Paris, Berlin, Vienna, New York, Chicago, Boston, Philadelphia and Detroit, the name of the city without the relative state or province in combination with "Made in", "Produced in," "Printed in," and words of similar import, or with the name of the manufacturer or producer, will be accepted as satisfactory."
