and chattels of the said J. D. Levi
in the said dwellinghouse then being
found feloniously and burglariously did
steal take and carry away against the
form of the statute in such case made
and provided and against the peace of
our Lady the Queen her crown and dignity.

their oath present that the said Ah Bow

hundred and seventy one One gold watch
one gold chain, one pair of bracelets and
fifty dollars in money of the value in the

whole of Five pounds and upwards of the
goods and chattels of the said S.

then well knowing the said goods and
chattels to have been feloniously stolen taken
and carried away against the form of
the statute in such case made and provided
and against the peace of our Lady the
