for our duty the Queen upon their
oath present. That here to fore do wit
on the twenty sixth day of July in
the year of our Lord one thousand
eight hundred and sixty six at the
City of Victoria in the Colony aforesaid
a certain judicial proceeding to wit
an inquest was holden before one
Augustus Frederic Pemberton Esquire
one of Her Majestys justices of the Peace
in & for the said Colony & duly
appointed to act as coroner & to hold
Coroners inquests in the said City
to inquire into the causes of the
deaths of persons found dead within

The said City and at the said
inquest a jury of jurymen was
duly assembled & sworn to inquire into
the cause of the death of one Edmund
Wain before that time found dead within
the said City and to give their verdict
thereupon. And at the said inquest
Timothy an Indian late of the City of
Victoria in the said Colony laborer
appeared and was examined as a
witness touching the cause of the death
of the said Edmund Wain & was then
and there duly sworn & took his corporal
oath upon the Holy Gospel of God before
the said Augustus Frederic Pemberton
that the evidence which he the said Timothy
should give to the said Augustus Frederic
Pemberton & to the said jury so sworn as

aforsaid should be the truth, the
whole truth, & nothing but the truth
(See the said Augustus Frederic Deuberton
then & there having sufficient and
competent authority, to administer the
said Oath to the said Timothy). And
the jurors aforsaid upon their Oath
aforsaid further present that at the
said inquest, it became ~~and~~ was a
material question in order to account
for the cause of the death of the said
Edmund Lewis that he the said

Timothy should truly state where ~~at~~
and in the company of what persons he
the said Timothy was during the
night of Sunday the ~~22~~ twenty second
day of July in the year aforsaid ~~at~~
and the morning of Sunday the
twenty third day of July in the year aforsaid

And the jurors aforesaid upon
their Oath aforesaid further present
that the said Timothy being so sworn
as aforesaid not having the fear of
God before his eyes but being moved
and seduced by the instigation of the
devil & and contriving and intending
to pervert the due course of law, and
justice, and to mislead the said
Jury. Then and there at the said
inquest upon his oath aforesaid
falsely, corruptly, knowingly and
wilfully before the said jurors so sworn
as aforesaid, and before the said Augustus
Ferdini Pemberton so sitting as such forwer
aforesaid did depose & swear (amongst
other things) in substance and to the
effect following that is to say that.

on the night of Sunday the twenty
second day of July in the year aforesaid
he the said Timothy was at the house
of a sister of him the said Timothy
whose name is to the said jurors unknown
and then had his supper at six of
the clock in the said evening of the said
day and did not afterwards go out
of the said house during the said
evening and night and that he the
said Timothy afterwards went to sleep
and did sleep in the said house during
the said evening and night and
on the morning of Monday the twenty
third day of July in the year aforesaid
whereas in truth and in fact on the
night of the said twenty second day of
July in the year aforesaid he the said

Timothy was not at the house of
the sister of the said Timothy ~~at~~ ~~the~~
~~the~~ ~~the~~ ~~the~~ ~~the~~ and
did not have his supper at six of the
clock of the evening of the said twenty
second day of July in the year aforesaid
nor at any hour of the said evening or
night of the said last mentioned day
and did not afterwards go out of the
said House, & did not afterwards go to
sleep, nor did he the said Timothy
sleep in the said house, during the said
evening or night of the said last mentioned
day, or the morning of Monday the
twenty third day of July in the year aforesaid
nor during any part of the said evening
night or morning last aforesaid
And so the jurors aforesaid upon their

Oath aforesaid do say that the said
Lieuwen on the said twenty sixth day
of July in the year aforesaid. at Victoria
aforesaid, in the Colony aforesaid before
the said Augustus Frederic Pemberton
so sitting as such Coroner as aforesaid
(He the said Augustus Frederic Pemberton
having such power and authority as
aforesaid) and before the said jurors
at the said inquest by his own act
& consent and of his own wicked
& corrupt mind in manner
and form aforesaid falsely wickedly
wilfully and corruptly did commit
wilful and corrupt perjury to the
great displeasure of Almighty God, in
contempt of our Lady the Queen, ^{and} her
Laws, to the evil and pernicious example

of all others in like case offending
and against the peace of Our Lady
the Queen her crown and Dignity
