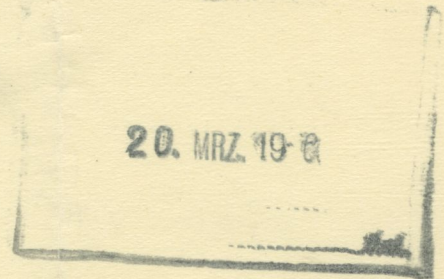

Dear Sir:-

In reply to your inquiry of March 19th, re return of empty glass carboys to Germany, I beg to say, without obligation, that as far as I know, no special documents are required for the return of empties. It is for the consignee in Germany to prove to the customs authorities that the goods returned are identical with the goods shipped by him to the Canadian sender. It would appear to be helpful, however, to the German firm if you would send him the original invoices for the goods, in which the carboys are mentioned, together with a declaration by the Canadian consignee to the effect that the goods returned are identical with those received from the firm to whom they are being returned.
