Trustees Report Regarding By-laws Status and Voting Eligibility of Acting
Grievance Committee Chair on the Executive

AN OPINION AND RULING HAS BEEN SOUGHT FROM RAY ARSENAULT, REGIONAL DIRECTOR
OF CUPE.

1. The chair of the grievance committee is tied to the elected position of first vice-president, and nowhere is there a ruling that the acting chair of the grievance committee can vote on the executive.
2. The sections of the by-laws document dated August 24, 1987 which were approved in a membership meeting are valid and in force as rules and regulations.

Minutes of the meeting of June 9, 1987, show conclusively that the attached sections are in force.

3. On other matters, established practice has considerable weight, but if this is in conflict with the outline by-laws of Appendix B of the CUPE constitution, the constitution prevails.
