Dear Sirs,

In reply to your inquiry of May 25th, addressed to the German Consul at Ottawa, I beg to say that no special forms are required for goods returned to Germany as far as the German customs are concerned. It will be advisable that you attach the original invoice for the articles in question to the shipping documents, or else return the invoice to the senders with a certificate signed by you, that the articles covered by the invoice in question are being returned to sender as per bill of lading. The consignee in Germany will have no difficulty in explaining the identity of the articles to the German customs authorities.

As regards forms to be filled out for the Canadian customs authorities, I regret that I have to refer you to the local Collector of Customs.
