To Wit:

The Information and Complaint of *Selciletchon*  
of *Somenos*, district of *Cowichan* in the Colony aforesaid, taken the  
eleventh day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty six

before me

one of Her Majesty's Justices

the Peace for the said Colony of Vancouver Island and its Dependencies, who being sworn upon his

Oath, saith

*Through Harry Bellmer who is  
strong to interpret truly, about one month  
ago I was at my house at the Somenos Camp  
I saw an Indian named Sealumpton sitting  
down near the fire, shortly afterwards a  
Somenos Indian named Pelequalce  
entered at the door, Sealumpton then got  
up and walked towards him, Pelequalce  
was a little drunk and put one arm round  
his neck, Sealumpton without any provocation  
drew a knife and stabb'd him in the  
abdomen, An Indian woman named  
Squalaquelet was present when this took  
place, Sealumpton also stabb'd her  
when he had done this he went away  
the next night Pelequalce died.  
Sealumpton was a little drunk at the  
time.*

Cornishaw I am ony thirtenth  
Eighteen Hundred and Sixty Six

Having been duly sworn deponent say  
Pallak. Sometime Ordinary deproofer  
and saith about four weeks ago I was  
mentioning the fire in my house.  
I heard Mr deceased who was drunk  
shouting outside my house.  
Sealupton was in my house and  
was drunk he walked towards the  
deceased who had a knife in his hand.  
The deceased was shouting that no one  
should take him as he had a knife  
in his hand. Sealupton walked  
towards him near the door. They  
walked together towards each other  
I saw a knife in the hands of  
the prisoner, but there was not much  
light as there was but a small fire.  
I did not see the prisoner stab the  
deceased, says when the deceased  
came to the fire I saw that he was  
stabbed in the abdomen, before then  
the deceased did not appear to know  
that he was stabbed, the prisoner  
then went to his bed. I was present  
when I heard the deceased tell his  
blood wife it was Sealupton who  
had stabbed him.

Sometime January Thirtenth  
Eighteen hundred and Sixty Six.

Dr. John Dane, before Dr. D.  
deposeth and saith, I was  
called out to see the deceased  
on the Twenty third of December  
last. I found him with a wound  
of about three and a half inches in  
length on the left side, which  
appeared to be occasioned by a knife  
and the greater part of the small  
intestines were protruding. The  
deceased <sup>said he</sup> was laying <sup>up</sup> besides  
another Indian asleep, and that  
he was stab'd and did not know  
who did it. I have no doubt that  
the deceased died from the  
effects of the wound, he died  
the next morning. I identify  
the body as that of the deceased  
named by the Jury.
