In reply to your letter of May 23rd, I beg
to return its enclosure.

This office is not in a position to issue
~~the same~~ permits for the importation of fire-arms into
Germany. I would say, however, that, as far as I know, there
is no special permission required for the importation of a
gun which is being sent to a gun manufacturer for altera-
tions. I have no doubt that Mr. Kessler will be able to
clear the shipment through the customs.

I take it that you are able to read Mr.
Kessler's letter in which he asks you to send him the
entire gun and to add a cartridge shell as a sample.
