## **Biographical History:**

Thomas Brayshaw was born March 3, 1886, in Stackhouse in Yorkshire, England. He moved to British Columbia by 1911. He returned to England with World War I, serving in the Duke of Wellington's Regiment, part of the Territorial Force, including a role as a revolver instructor. He was seriously injured the Western Front in France in 1915.

He married Edith Rebecca Sugden, who he met while she was a member of the Voluntary Aid Detachment searching with the Red Cross, in Wakefield in 1916. They had one son, Thomas Christopher Brayshaw. The family returned to British Columbia in 1920.

Brayshaw worked as a fruit grower and schoolmaster at Vernon Preparatory School in Vernon, B. C., until joining the WWII efforts from 1940-1945. He served as an army counsellor and recruiting officer, reaching the rank of major.

He was a well-known sport fisherman and devoted most of his adult life to catching, studying and drawing of fish, illustrating several of Roderick Haig-Brown's books. Brayshaw achieved recognition for his wooden fish carvings. He was a founding member of the Hope Rod and Gun Club, serving as president from 1948-1961, and a charter member of the Federation of Fly Fishermen. He died October 10, 1967, in Vancouver, B.C.

### **Custodial history**

The original acquisition (Part 1) was donated by Stanley E. Read to the University Archives in 1971. It was transferred to Rare Books and Special Collections in 1978. The accrual (Part 2) was acquired from the estate of Thomas Brayshaw's son, T. C. Brayshaw, in 2016.

## Scope and content

The fonds consists primarily of Thomas Brayshaw's fishing diaries (1932-1964) and correspondence, manuscripts, and subject files (1907-1967). This is largely reflective of Brayshaw's work and related interests. The fonds also contains a collection of documents and research related to the Brayshaw

family, containing genealogical research, and family photographs, personal records and artefacts. This includes some personal records of Thomas Brayshaw, notably war service records, and some photographs and fishing flies related to his work and interests.

#### Arrangement

PART 1 (Boxes 1-5) is the original acquisition of Thomas Brayshaw's papers, arranged and described according to how the files were received.

PART 2 (Boxes 6-9) is the accrual, consisting of the Brayshaw family memorabilia. The arrangement is based on the order of the materials presented in the inventory listing, compiled by T. C. Brayshaw, and included in file 06-01. Some items listed on the inventory were not received as part of the accrual. Books included in the inventory were separated from the archival records to the Rare Books and Special Collections library.

#### Introduction

The Thomas Brayshaw Papers were Donated to the University by Stanley Read in November 1971 and transferred from the University Archives to the Manuscript Section of the Special Collections Division in September, 1978.

Tommy Brayshaw was born in Yorkshire, England and moved to Canada in the early 1900's. He was a well-known sport fisherman and devoted the majority of his adult years to the catching, studying and drawing of fish. Brayshaw illustrated several of Roderick Haig-Brown's books, including The Western Angler and the fish portion of Living Land. Brayshaw achieved a fair degree of fame for his carving and painting of fish models from solid blocks of wood. Two sets of six fish each which he carved in 1939 for the Canadian Fishing Company were exhibited all over North America.

Brayshaw spent his retirement years in Hope, B.C. after earning a living as a fruit grower in the Okanagan between the two wars. The arrangement of these papers has attempted to maintain the original order which Brayshaw had already created. Most material was already organized in labelled folders when it arrived at the University so the materials within each folder were kept together.

## **Custodial history**

In 1987, the son of Thomas Brayshaw, Thomas Christopher Brayshaw (T. C. Brayshaw) contacted Rare Books and Special Collections regarding the materials in this accrual. T. C. Brayshaw indicated that he was the last of his family line and was interested in donating a trunk of family memorabilia he had inherited. No other custodial information was provided. After a brief correspondence between T. C. Brayshaw and the archivist in 1988, no further actions were taken. The materials came to Rare Books and Special Collections in 2016 through the estate of T. C. Brayshaw.

## Scope and content

The series consists primary of textual records, a large number relating to the Brayshaw family history and genealogy, tracing the family back to the sixteenth century. This includes partial family trees, correspondence regarding genealogical research, information on the family crest and pedigree, some official documents such as marriage certificates, and many notes. Much of the records reflect the family's roots in the Settle, Yorkshire area of England.

Other textual records include newspaper clippings, correspondence, and official commissions and records of service books—listing training taken, service at home and abroad—as well as ephemera such as ration books, receipts, and rail cards from Thomas Brayshaw's army service in World War I and World War II, and T. C. Brayshaw's Royal Canadian Air Force Observer's and Air Gunner's flying log book from World War II.

Photographs in the series represent family members and family homes, dating back to at least 1915 and into the 1960s, many with persons and/or locations written on the back. Additional photos include Thomas Brayshaw's revolver training and portraits and photos of men in uniform during WWI. Photographs related to Thomas Brayshaw's later work and interests in fishing and wildlife, as well as some hand-made and described fishing flies.

The family memorabilia also contains a number of artefacts, including coins, small oak panels, and framed items. Six books were part of the acquisition but removed from the archival holdings for cataloguing and preservation in the Rare Books and Special Collections library. These books include family bibles and prayer books with genealogical information tracked on blank pages, works written by family members or otherwise passed down through the generations.

## Arrangement

The materials were received in a black metal trunk (RBSC-ARC-1048-Box 7). They were removed from the box and processed for preservation. All materials were retained, in order to give a sense of the storage and condition in which they were passed down.

The files are arranged and titled according to the order of the inventory prepared by T. C. Brayshaw (found in file 06-01). When materials did not have an exact corresponding title, the archivist created one—square brackets around the file title indicate these instances. In some cases, items within a file are placed in an envelope within the file—for example, newspaper clippings. This is for better preservation and protection of all the textual records.

Textual records are found in Box 6 as well as oversize map folders. Box 7 is the metal trunk that originally contained the family memorabilia, Box 8 contains artefacts and Box 9 contains coins.

Book titles and descriptions can be found in file 06-01, and the books can be located in the library catalogue through their association with the Thomas Brayshaw fonds.
