With reference to your call at this office, I have pleasure in sending you herewith a list showing the customs duties as near as I can ascertain them.

As I explained to you verbally, authentic customs information can only be obtained from the customs authorities in Germany, through the Canadian Trade Commissioner at Hamburg.

with regard to a number of the articles enumerated in your list, classification is very difficult, such as, for instance, for electrical kitchen utensils, and stoves and furnaces. In these cases it would be essential to know the materials of which they are made and the degree of finish. However, I believe that the rates I am giving you for Nos. 1, 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7 are correct. The rate is charged throughout per unit of one hundredkilos.
