



RECOGNISANCE OF BAIL.

BE IT REMEMBERED, that on the *Twenty third* day of *March*
in the *Thirty fourth* year of the Reign of Queen Victoria, *Henry*
Sampson, William Curran, and an Indian
named, *Cush ka nam*
cometh before me, *Geo Proctor* Esquire, one of Her
Majesty's Justices of the Peace for the said *Province*, and acknowledges *himself* to owe to our said Lady
the Queen, that is to say the said *Henry Sampson, William*
Curran, and Cush ka nam, the sum of
two hundred dollars each

to be respectively levied of *their* lands and tenements, goods and chattels, if the said *Henry Sampson*
William Curran, and Cush ka nam

shall make default in the performance of the condition underwritten hereon.

THE CONDITION of this Recognizance is such that if the above bounden *Henry Sampson*
William Curran, and Cush ka nam, shall personally appear

before the Justices of our Sovereign Lady the Queen (assigned
to keep the peace within the said Province and likewise
to hear and determine divers felonies, trespasses, and other
misdeamours in the said Province committed) at the next
Assizes of the Peace to be holden in and for the said Province at
Victoria in the said Province, and then and there give evidence
to our Sovereign Lady the Queen, for and concerning
the Charge of Murder with suspicion whereof the said
Stand charged before Geo Proctor the said
Justice, and to do and receive what shall by the Court be then
and there enjoined him,

then the above written Recognizance shall be void.
