REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE FREE ENTRY OF  
PURE BRED DOMESTIC FOWLS FOR THE  
IMPROVEMENT OF STOCK

Tariff Item No. 2

Baby Chicks. — No free entry is to be accepted for Baby Chicks unless the importer submits with the entry a sworn declaration from the owner and shipper in the form as shown in the schedule of forms hereto, marked "A."


Under Schedule "A", a declaration, including a pedigree, must be submitted for each Chick, and each Chick must be banded and have the band number shown on the pedigree.

Adult Fowls. — No free entry is to be accepted for Adult Fowls unless the importer submits a certificate from the shipper in the form as shown in the schedule of forms hereto, marked "B."

Collectors will note that differentiation between baby chicks and adult fowls is that the latter are to be fully feathered.

It is also to be particularly noted that the band number is to be quoted on the declaration or certificate.

TARIFF ITEM No. 1

ANIMALS FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF STOCK

(Memorandum No. 2363B is hereby superseded)

The following are the regulations now in force respecting the free admission of animals for the improvement of stock:—

REGULATIONS

1. Animals may be imported for the improvement of stock free of duty upon the furnishing of an import certificate stating that the animal is recorded in a Canadian National Record, or in case there is no Canadian Record for the breed, in a foreign record recognized as authentic by the Canadian National Live Stock Record Committee.

(a) By a British subject resident in the British Empire, or if more than one owner, each is a British subject resident in the British Empire.

A statutory declaration by the owner or one of the owners that he is a British subject, or that each is a British subject resident in the British Empire and that such animal is the identical animal described in the import certificate and is being imported into Canada for the improvement of stock, must be provided.

(b) By a citizen of the United States actually owning a farm in Canada and bona fide conducting thereon the business of stock raising provided the animal was actually owned by the importer before importation and is being imported solely for breeding operations on his farm and not for the purpose of sale and on conditions that the animal be not sold or otherwise disposed of without the payment of duty until the expiry of twelve months after the date of importation.

A statutory declaration by the owner that he owns a farm in Canada and is bona fide conducting thereon the business of stock raising and that he owned the animal abroad and that it is being imported solely for breeding operations on his farm and not for the purpose of sale, must be provided.

2. In case such certificate is not at hand at the time of the arrival of the animals, entry for duty may be accepted subject to the refund of the duty upon the production of the requisite certificates and proofs in due form satisfactory to the collector within one year from the time of entry.

3. In the case of horses, for the purpose of identification the Health of Animals Branch of the Department of Agriculture shall examine each animal as to age, colour and markings and supply a certificate, embodying these

particulars, to the Accountant of the Canadian National Live Stock Records, before he may issue an import certificate.

4. The form of certificate to be accepted for the free importation of animals for the improvement of stock, and the customs procedure in connection therewith shall be subject to the direction of the Minister of National Revenue.

5. The above declaration shall be attached to the Free Import Entry and may be made before the collector, sub-collector, surveyor, or chief clerk at the port where the goods are entered or before any functionary authorized by law to administer oaths.

### INSTRUCTIONS

(a) Import Certificates required are those bearing the signature of the Accountant of the Canadian National Live Stock Records, for horses, cattle, sheep, goats, asses, swine and dogs (but not including the Holstein-Friesian cattle). Import certificates required for Holstein-Friesian cattle are those bearing the signature of the Secretary of the Holstein-Friesian Association of Canada.

(b) The Import Certificate and declaration to be delivered to the Collector of Customs before free entry of animals is allowed, shall be in one of the forms in the schedule hereto.

(c) The Import Certificate for horses shall specify the colour and natural markings, if any; if there are no markings the word "solid" shall be inserted. The Collector of Customs is required to compare the description given on the Import Certificate with the animal and if the colour and markings do not agree, free entry must be refused and duty collected.

(d) The Import Certificate shall be attached to the Free Customs Entry for transmission by the Collector to the Department of National Revenue, Ottawa.

The said Certificate shall be marked in each case with the Customs entry number and the office dating stamp.


The Collector of Customs shall not demand or accept any Certificate as to pedigree, other than in one of the "Import Certificate" forms herein prescribed and the Declaration of Ownership.

(e) Animals may be shipped in bond from the Canadian frontier port to the Customs port of destination, subject to quarantine requirements.

(f) Import Certificates for Holstein-Friesian cattle are issued by the Secretary of the Holstein-Friesian Association of Canada, St. George, Ont.

(g) Import Certificates for Live Stock other than Holstein-Friesian cattle may be procured on application to "Accountant," Canadian National Live Stock Records, Ottawa, from whom there may also be obtained a list of Canadian Records and other information concerning the importation of pure-bred animals for the improvement of stock.


### REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE FREE ADMISSION OF PURE BRED CHINCHILLA, ANGORA AND SABLE RABBITS FOR THE IMPROVE- MENT OF STOCK

(Tariff Items 786, 787 and 787a)

Pure Bred Chinchilla, Angora and Sable Rabbits, for the improvement of stock, are admitted into Canada free of Customs duties under Tariff Items 786, 787 and 787a, respectively, under regulations prescribed by the Minister of Agriculture, which are printed herewith—Vide Orders in Council, dated 30th July, 1925 (P.C. 2/1245), 22nd February, 1927 (P.C. 5/296) and 5th November, 1928 (P.C. 21/2009), respectively.

The certificate of breeding and the declarations required under the regulations shall be produced by the importer and shall be attached to the entry for transmission by the Collector to the Department of National Revenue, Ottawa, the certificates and declarations to be marked in each case with the entry number and the office dating stamp.

Memoranda Nos. 58, 72 and supplement, and 135 and supplement are hereby superseded.

*Breeder's Declaration.*—No free entry is to be accepted for Chinchilla, Angora or Sable Rabbits unless the Importer submits with the entry a Certificate of Breeding of each Rabbit in the form as shown in the schedule of forms hereto marked "A" and also produces the Breeder's Declaration following, as shown in the schedule of forms marked "B."

*Importer's Declaration.*—The Importer must also furnish a sworn declaration in the form as shown in the schedule of forms hereto marked "C."
