Dear Sir:

In reply to your letter of December 30th - KEK/MK - I beg to enclose herewith copy of a reply received from the Commissioner of Customs, Canada, with regard to the rates of duty on Magnesium Carbonate and Magnesium Oxide under both the British preferential tariff and the Treaty tariff (U.S. and Germany).

The Tariff Item 208t referred to in the letter reads as follows:

All chemicals and drugs when of a kind not produced in Canada, which were on August 20, 1932 dutiable at rates of 15, 25 and 25% under Tariff Item 711.....

British Preferential Tariff	25 p.c.
Intermediate Tariff	25 p.c.
General Tariff	25 p.c.

In case you would like to submit samples of Magnesium Oxide for analysis and classification, I would suggest that you communicate direct with the Commissioner of Customs, Ottawa, Ont.
