

Ah, Bow, Chinaman,
charged by Constable Stewart with
breaking into the house of S. J. Levi
at Nanaimo, on the night of Wednesday
the 12th July, and stealing therefrom ^{various}
articles, namely,

A gold watch & gold chain,
A pair of gold bracelets, and
A sum of money, about \$50.00.

Constable Stewart having been
daily sworn States. From informa-
-tion I received from Mr. Levi I
went to the house of Ah Bow, and
on making a search I found a
gold watch & some money hidden
in a match box. ~~The~~ ~~prisoner~~
Mr. Levi at once identified the
watch as his property, and also
several pieces of foreign coin
as being a portion of the money
stolen. The prisoner claimed the
match box which contained the
watch and money as his property as
also the whole of the goods on the

premises, I cautioned him to say
nothing that would commit him-
self, and searched his person
but found nothing material.

I arrested him and conveyed him
to Gaol. Constable Mr. Millan
of the Victoria Police Force who
happened to be present in Haulains
recognised the prisoner as having
been previously convicted in
Victoria.

I was present when
constable Stuart searched the
house of the prisoner Ah Bow.
The Watch ~~and~~ chain produced
in front I recognise as the one
found in a boy in the prisoners
house & claimed by him as his property.
He seemed reluctant to give up
this boy, and I took it out
of his hands forcibly.

States. My house was broken into
on the night of Wednesday the 12th July
and property to a considerable amount
stolen therefrom, amongst which
were a gold watch & gold chain,
a pair of bracelets, and about
\$50.00 in cash. I likewise the
watch & chain produced as my
property. I also believe certain foreign
coins produced to be my property
and also a small coin which was
found upon the person of the
prisoner. An instrument produced
in court was also found in
the prisoners house
