**CZECHS WITHDRAW
EXHIBIT AT C.N.E.**

Czechoslovakia has finally decided not to exhibit at the C.N.E.

"Suitable arrangements could not be reached," was the excuse offered.

The Czechs, Slovaks and Ruthenians are finding enough trouble in keeping their own relations straight due to their constantly changing nationalities in Europe. An exhibition to advertise a country that no longer exists, one of them stated, seemed a little futile.

Poland, "due to the present European situation," also had to withdraw their application for the space they have reserved. Consul-General Jan Pavlica, in Ottawa, has been recalled. This would have been the second year that Poland exhibited.

That leaves Netherlands, France, Finland, Latvia, Switzerland, Estonia and Germany to exhibit in the International Building. Opposite the German exhibit will be a feature attraction "Holy Land Show," the only exhibit in the building charging admission.
