Dear Sir:-

In reply to your letter of January 9th, which has been referred to this office, I beg to say that there is no restriction, as far as I am informed against the sending of a bear skin and moccasins to Germany.

This office is not authorized to give any binding informations as to customs-duty, but I would say that it would be advisable to be certain that the items to be sent are free from any disease. The consignee will have to pay the duty but I presume that a bear skin if it has not been tanned is duty free. It would not make any difference wether the parcel is shipped by post or by express.
