

In the Court of Bankruptcy

Wednesday the 26th day of October A.D. 1864

In the Matter of Alfred Robertson a Bankrupt
Last Examination

Bankrupt very duly sworn was Examined by Sir Bishop
for Evidence said. I have not been carrying on business since
the adjudication I have been conducting the Pony Saloon. Mr
Waterman was the last occupier. I never paid him any
thing I made an agreement to pay him anything I went
to manage the Pony Saloon for Mr. Shields & Co. Mr. Shields my
wife now I paid Waterman a fortnight. Mr. Shields paid him
for the business. Waterman never applied to me for payment
I was to receive \$80 a month for managing the business. I received
a portion of it I lent him money & a part of it went to pay it
I don't believe I stated on my last examination that I paid him
off by shares - I borrowed money from him since my bankruptcy
to support my wife & myself. I have not bought any goods in my
own name from Mr. Miles. They were bought for Mr. Shields now
He has been away and back several times. He came from
Tooke about three weeks ago - I have not settled up with him
He is satisfied. He lodged & boarded with me before - I asked Mr. Moore
for goods. I did not know that they came from Shields & Stewart
until afterwards - I spoke to Waterman about Mr. Shields buying
him out. I did not go to him. I did not ask Miles to
supply me with goods. I thought they came from Moore. I only
knew they were from Miles by the bill. They are paid. They were
paid to Miles. I told Mr. Shields now that I had ordered goods from Miles.
The first bill I had nothing to do with - I have no idea of the
amount of profit in the goods. I told prior to bankruptcy I supposed
50 to. If I sold \$5000 the profit would be \$2500

in shares in the business carried on in the Pony Saloon
