

In the Court of Bankruptcy
Wednesday the 26th day of October A.D. 1864
In the Matter of Alfred Robertson a Bankrupt
Last Examination

Bankrupt being duly sworn was Examined by Mr Bishop
for Easton said I have not been carrying on business since
the adjudication I have been conducting the pony Saloon Mr
Waterman was the last occupier. I never paid him any
thing I made an agreement to pay him anything I went
to manage the pony Saloon for Mr Shattock & Riddle my
wife never I paid Waterman a farthing. Mr Shattock paid him
for the business Waterman never applied to me for payment
I was to receive \$80 a month for managing the business. I received
a portion of it I owed him money & a part of it went to pay it
I don't believe I stated on my last examination that I paid him
off by then, - I borrowed money from him since my bankruptcy
to support my wife & myself. I have not brought goods in my
own name from Mr Miles they were bought for Shattock & Riddle
He has been away and back several times. He came from
Tooke about three weeks ago. I have not settled up with him.
He is satisfied. He lodges & boards with me before I asked Mr. Moore
for goods. I did not know that they came from E. & S. I went
and telephoned - I spoke to Waterman about Shattock buying
him out I did not go to him I met him I did not ask him to
supply me with goods. I thought they came from Moore. Only
knew they were from Miles by the bill They are paid they were
paid to Miles. I told Shattock now that I had ordered goods from Miles
the first Bill I had nothing to do with - I have no idea of the
amount of profit on the goods I got prior to Bankruptcy I suppose
50 to 60 £ if I take £5000 the profit would be £1500

Examined by Mr Green I have no interest
or share in the business carried on in the pony Saloon
