In Bankruptcy

In the matter of John Joseph McCredy by
whom a Deed of Assignment for the benefit
of his Creditors has been filed dated the
Twenty first day of June in the year of our
Lord One Thousand eight hundred and
sixty six and in the matter of a
Summons issued out of this Honourable
Court and dated the 24th day of July
1866

I Jane Elizabeth McCredy wife of John
Joseph McCredy of Victoria Vancouver Island
Builder and Carpenter make oath and say
as follows that is to say

1. I am the mother of Thomas Henry McCredy
The said Thomas Henry McCredy has for four
or five years past and upwards advanced and
lent money on account of my husband and which
he has handed to me on account of Household
expenses - I have also drawn money with the
consent of my said Son from his late employer,
Mr Bell on account of Wages due to him -

2. During these several years considerable
sums have been advanced by my said Son
on account of my husband and I have heard
my said Son ask his father in my presence

for security for the monies owing to him -
my husband told him he would give a
security for what he owed on a lot in Fort
Street or in Ward -

3. my husband was absent in Cariboo in
the year One thousand eight hundred and
sixty two for several months, during which
period I obtained from my said Son several
sums of money which I applied in support of
my family at this time these monies were
the principal means of support -

4. After my husband obtained Two hundred
and ninety five dollars from W. Marvin or
had it allowed towards a Bill which my
husband owed to W. Marvin, he promised my
Son in my presence to buy a lot for him and
build a house on it for him or to invest the
amount for that purpose

5. In the month of May ^{s last} my husband last
told me that he was pressed by Mr Bishop to
give security for the amount which he (my
husband) owed to Thomas my said Son and
he supposed he would be forced to give a Bill
of Sale on the Furniture - I was afterwards
told by my Son that the Bill of Sale had been
given and he showed it to me - he took
possession of the Furniture and effects in the
House and on the premises and has been
in such possession ever since -

I have seen an account marked M

shewn to me at the time of my being sworn
before his Affidavit and I believe that the sum
set down and appearing in that account
has having been drawn by or advanced to
me as therein stated are correct - my son at
an earlier period had some smaller sums
