Whereas at a Court holden at *Court House Victoria* on the *23rd* day of *April* 18 *60*, the above-named plaintiff by the judgment of the said Court, in a certain suit in which the said Court had jurisdiction, recovered against the above-named defendant *Sixty eight* Pounds *thirteen* Shillings and *one* Pence, for a certain debt due and owing from the Defendant to the Plaintiff

and *Five* Pounds Shillings and Pence, the costs of suit by the Plaintiff in that behalf expended; amounting together to the sum of *Fifty three* Pounds *thirteen* Shillings and *one* Pence; and thereupon it was then and there ordered by the said Court, that the defendant should pay the same to the Registrar of the Court, at his office, on the *First* day of *May* instant

and whereas the said sum of *Fifty three pounds thirteen shillings one penny* has not been paid pursuant to the said order: these are therefore to require and order you forthwith to make and levy by distress and sale of the goods and chattels of the Defendant, wheresoever they may be found within the district of this Court (except the wearing apparel and bedding of the Defendant or his family, and the tools and implements of his trade, if any, to the value of Five Pounds) the said sum of *Fifty three* Pounds *thirteen* Shillings and *one* Pence, and also the Costs of this execution; and also to seize and take any money or bank notes (whether of the Bank of England or of any other bank), and any cheques, bills of exchange, promissory notes, bonds, specialties, or securities for money, of the Defendant, which may there be found, or such part or so much thereof as may be sufficient for the satisfying of this execution, and the Costs of making and executing the same, and to pay what you shall have

levied under this Writ to the Registrar of this Court, and make return of what you have done under this Writ immediately upon the execution thereof.
