Below are a few suggestions for German exhibits:

- 1. All commercial articles imported to Canada. It may be desirable, however, to stress such commodities as are not competitive to Canadian manufacturers.
- 2. A collection of German stamps and coins of different periods.

 This would be an interesting asset to the display and we should very much like to have such collections for each exhibiting country.
- 3. German art photography and photographic implements.
- 4. Handicrafts. There are particularly delightful things in the Schwarzwald Holzarbeiten and peasant products of that nature. Peasant costumes (Bauerntrachten) would also lend colour to the exhibit. Old, colourful beer-mugs are another example of what would fit in this section.
- 5. Tourist display.
- 6. Art-bindings, paintings, old music scores of the German masters.
- 7. Modern German periodicals and newspapers.
- 8. If available, such things as the armour of an ancient "Ordensritter", models of old Hansa ships etc. would be very interesting.

This is by no means a complete list of all the interesting things Germany could exhibit, and I am merely as a few things that would make the display an educational and colourful one.
