The Bankruptcy Act 1862.

The Humble Petition of John McAdoo
Wark a Chief Trader in the Hudson Bay Company,
Lorvic and Joseph Hardisty of the same Company

Sheweth

That Thomas Hester Farrell having
resided for eight months and
upwards immediately preceding
the date of this petition within the
District of this Honorable Court that
to wit say at Government Street
Victoria is indebted unto the Hudson
Bay Company in the sum of
Three hundred and thirty eight dollars fifty cents
and that your Petitioner has been
informed and believes that the
Said Thomas Hester Farrell
did lately commit an act of
bankruptcy within the true intent
and meaning of the Law of
bankruptcy

Your Petitioner therefore
humbly prays that
as proof of the requisites
in that behalf a declaration
of bankruptcy may be made
against the said Thomas

Austin Farrell
and your petition shall
ever pray

Signed by the petitioners
on the nineteenth day of
August 1843 in the presence of
Wm Tyndal & Drake
