Dear Carol,

I am writing in answer to your letter of March 13, 1981. Below you will find an explanation for the deductions.

In December of 1980, two referendum ballots were passed by the membership. One of the referenda allowed for an increase in union dues. Full-time employees, as of January 1, 1981 would pay \$12.00 per month. Part-time employees would pay \$5.75 per month. The other ballot approved by the membership involved an assessment which was intended to pay off strikerelated debts we incurred in May of 1980. Employees working at the University in January and February of 1981 were to deducted as follows:

30 - 35 hrs. per week - \$10 for January and \$10 for February
17 1/2 - 29 hrs. per week - \$5 for January and \$5 for February
Less than 17 1/2 hrs. per week - \$2.50 for January and \$2.50 for February

In order to calculate what you should have paid for dues and assessments, your total hours worked each month was divided by four and the results were as follows:

January: 63 hours 63 ÷ 4 = 15.75 or 15 3/4 hrs. per week Union dues: \$5.75 Assessment: \$2.50

February: 141 hours 141 + 4 = 35.25 or 35 1/4 hrs. per week Union dues: \$12.00 Assessment: \$10.00

To summarize, you should have paid \$30.25 in total for the months of January and February. As you were deducted \$38.50, we are refunding you \$8.25.
