6. Union Organizer's report

+Carole reported that she was working on getting the job standards printed and distributed.

+She further reported that the University has informed us that it will take about five weeks to prepare the appointment notices for the new positions so the Union office has arranged to get the slotting list and will be helping members with their appeals

+Carole has met with Capilano College re: the Stewards Seminar November 30 & December 14

+Purchasing -- four people worked on a Saturday on a volunteer basis and we complained so they paid them at overtime rates.

+Copy & Duplicating members want to be released from AUCF and have demanded a meeting with the Executive. They will be coming to this meeting.

+Received a hostile letter from the person in Education who had asked for release and been rejected.

+Certification variance -- nothing new to report

+Because of our agreement with the University with regard to Article 34.06(L) no new temporaries are being added to the floaters' list and some temporary work is being contracted out

Moved by Carole Cameron Seconded by Karen Shaw THAT WE PRINT A COPY OF THE BY-LAWS AS THEY PRESENTLY EXIST. The motion was CARRIED.

There was some discussion of the isolation of the hospital members.

The agenda was suspended to enable a group of members from Copy & Duplicating to make a presentation.

Copy & Duplicating Delegation

They presented a letter outlining their concerns, with a copy to the each member of the Executive.

Carole responded that the President of the Union had informed us that he had canvassed the AUCE members in their dept. and that they were not unanimous in their wish to leave AUCE.

They responded that they had not been consulted and asked if the Executive was prepared to release them.

They were told no.

They asked what the difference between their situation and other AUCE members that had been released was.

Carole explained that historically C & D has been represented by AUCE and their release would fragment our bargaining unit. Others that have been released were isolated individuals who were clearly not within the domain of our certification and were placed in our unit by mistake. We have given serious consideration to the very difficult situation the C & D members are in.

Tom Moore speaking on behalf of the delegation said that they felt they had been inadequately represented and that the recent slotting was the most glaring example.

Carole explained that every attempt was made by the Contract Committee to address their concerns but the employer was unwilling to accept any of our representaions and the membership directed us to stop negotiating.

The delegation said they are tradespeople not clerks and would be more properly represented by CUPE. AUCE provides no stability for AUCE members in that department. We have to live under these conditions and we appeal for your support and a voluntary release from AUCE. They asked that the Executive consider common sense over political issues. They then left the meeting.

There was a thorough discussion of the whole issue within the Executive
