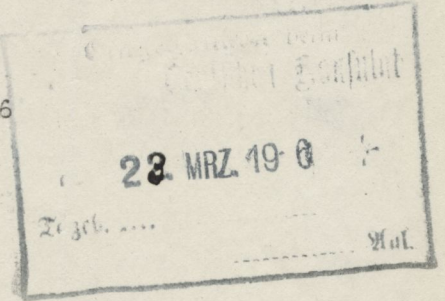

Can you advise us if there is any particular form required when shipping, which will avoid payment of any German Duty when this lot of glassware re-enters Germany.

In reply to your letter of March 22nd,
LH/AM. As far as I am aware, no particular forms are
required when shipping returned goods to Germany. It
will be for the German consignee to satisfy the German
customs authorities that the goods returned to them are
identical with those shipped by the German firm to you.
I would suggest that you mail to Messrs. Keiner & Co.
their original invoice, together with a declaration by
your firm that the goods you are returning are those
which have been sold to you by Messrs. Keiner & Co.
