WHEREAS the response to these revelations on the part of high ranking government officials, among them the Prime Minister, has been that only those with something to hide will insist on their right to privacy and civil liberty;

WHEREAS the chief law enforcer in Canada, Solicitor-General Blais, maintains that the hundreds of breakins without warrant were not illegal because there was no criminal intent;

WHEREAS the abovementioned illegal acts constitute particular harrassment of native people, dissidents, Quebecois and trade unionists;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Provincial Association of AUCE protest the illegal invasions of privacy and erosion of civil liberties, and call for the prosecution of these illegal acts committed by the RCMP, security forces, civil servants and government agents and agencies.
