The plaintiff claims \$95.10 due to him as the  
account of principal and interest of a pro-  
note, of which the following is a copy.

\$400.<sup>00</sup> Two months after date we promise  
to pay James Richardson or order the sum  
of four hundred dollars, with interest at  
the rate of two per cent per month for value  
received until paid, G. Watson & Co.

May 1<sup>st</sup> 1865

per William Robertson

And if the account thereof be  
paid to the plaintiff or his Counsel, within four  
days from the service hereof, further proceedings  
will be stayed. And the said George  
Watson has not appeared.

Therefore it is considered  
that the said James Richardson recover  
against the said George Watson \$102.54
