Upon the application of the Plaintiffs and
upon hearing Mr McCreight their Counsel and
upon reading the affidavits of John Copland
filed on the seventh day of July one thousand eight
hundred and sixty four, of George Balls filed on the
day of One thousand eight hundred
and sixty of George Mason filed on the Eighth day of
July one thousand eight hundred and sixty seven
of Robert Bishop filed on the Twentieth day of
November One thousand eight hundred and sixty
seven and the several affidavits of George Mason
and George Balls, John Copland, Alfred A Townsend
and Robert Bishop all respectively filed on the
Twenty seventh day of November one thousand eight
hundred and sixty seven, and it appearing that
the Defendant William Rowland is out of the
jurisdiction of this Court and cannot be found
and hath made default in payment according to
the decree in this cause and it further appearing
that in consequence of such default a final order
for fore closure hath been made herein and the
defendant William Rowland ordered to execute
a Conveyance to the Plaintiffs of the Morediments

referred to in the said final order of foreclosure;
This Court doth Order and declare that
the Defendant William Rowland shall be
deemed a Trustee of the said Hereditaments
within the meaning of the Trustee Act and that
the same do vest in the Plaintiffs for the estate
therein of the said Defendant William Rowland
And any of the parties interested are to be at
liberty to apply as there shall be occasion. -
