I fauc been Baron Silvercruys, Belgian min-ister to Canada, arrived here yes-terday afternoon to attend the ceremonies in connection with the first Belgo-Canadian week. He is extending the usual length of his visits to Montreal to welcome the trade mission which ar-

extending the usual length of his visits to Montreal to welcome the Belgian trade mission which ar-rives on Saturday, and to be pres-ent at the opening of the exhibi-tion of Belgan art on Tuesday. The minister spent part of yes-terday afternoon in Henry Morgan & Co.'s store examining many of the pieces now being arranged for the opening ceremonies, which will be performed by Lord Tweedsmuir, Governor-General of Canada. The exhibition has been arranged by the Association Belgique-Canada with the patronage of the Belgian Government.

MODERN ART

MODERN ART
It consists largely of examples of modern Belgian art, the 130 paintings including canvases by Victor Gilsoul, Herman Coutens, and other distinguished artists. Modern furniture, sculpture, potery and crystals will also be shown. There are two 17th century Brussel's tapestries, v al u e d at about \$2,000 each. Colonial art is peresented by native crafts from the Belgian Congo.
A large section is devoted to refigure and church ornaments, including statutary and stained plass. Books exemplify fine bindings, and school text books are also shown. There is also a small commercial exhibit of cutlery, tablevate, tiles, and lace. A small colection of renaissance furniture has been brought over to show Belgian craftmanship of former days.

COAT OF ARMS The city of Antwerp is sending its coat of arms, set with precious stones and valued at \$5,000, to be placed on exhibition on opening day. Many maps, photographs and graphic representations of Belgian-Canadian trade figures will adorn the walls. the walls.

Workmen were busy yesterday afternoon preparing the exhibits, and the Belgian Minister and his party stepped under ladders and scaffolds, peering down at paint-ings on the floor level. The exhibi-tion is to be held on the fifth floor of the store. of the store.
