Customs Valuation of Reichsmarks

We have your note of the 27th May, from which we learn that you have been advised that the Canadian Government will, for duty purposes, allow calculation of Reichsmarks at a value of 32¢ instead of the current bankers' value of 40¢, and that this may help the importation of Barytes from Germany.

A ruling to that effect was issued some time ago by the Canadian Customs authorities, but unfortunately for us the ruling was ~~with-~~<sup>amended</sup> drawn, so that while the Fair Market Value for Home Consumption as shown on Customs Invoices may be calculated at 32¢ - RM, the actual selling price to the Canadian purchaser has still to be calculated at the current rate, which is 40.3¢. and when you deduct from the selling price the transportation and other costs, also calculated at 40.3¢ - RM, you find that there is a difference between the Fair Market Value as shown on your Customs Invoice and the Fair Market Value as calculated by deduction of transportation and other charges from the selling price, and this difference is taken into consideration when the Customs Department assesses duty, so that there is no advantage except to those German shippers who are willing to sell in Canada at less than the Market Value for Home Consumption; in other words, those who are willing to dump.

For instance, suppose the Fair Market Value of Barytes were RM.50, the transportation and other charges RM.19, the selling price in Canada c.i.f. should be approximately RM.69. Now, RM.50 at 32¢ is \$17.50; RM.69 at 40.3¢ is \$27.80 RM.19 transportation, etc., at 40.3¢ is \$7.68, and the Customs insist on calculating Duty on the \$27.81 less \$7.68, which is a value of \$20.13, which is exactly the same as calculating the Fair Market Value of RM.50 at 40.3¢, a value of \$20.15, so until Customs authorities can change their viewpoint, there can be no sale.
