Report.

In the matter of A. L. Brown

leave to report to your Lordships that
in accordance with your Lordships
order of the 7th inst I attended at the
Gaol this morning at 10 o'clock when
the prisoner declined to file his petition
in Bankruptcy. - I am informed that
on or about the day of his arrest,
he received about eight hundred
dollars.

prisoner or his solicitor do pay the
sum of Ten Dollars Fee to the
Registrar for preparing the necessary
papers and for his attendance
at the Gaol
