I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of February 9th pertaining to new prices fixed by the Department at Ottawa on German made "STILLSON" and "CRESCENT" Pattern wrenches, and I thank you very much for your information given.

Please note that I have written to the Commercial Attache at the Consulate in Montreal, submitting our prices and asking them to make a strong protest to the government. As your letter does not give any details pertaining to the fixed values, I would appreciate it very much if you would give confidentially any information to this gentleman, as no doubt, he will be able to assist our general cause.

I also have protested through the medium of the Importers & Traders Association.

Please keep me posted of any developments at the above address. I am leaving tonight for Germany for a short trip and I shall also make the necessary representation there. As far as I could gather, the new ruling starts on February 1st, 1938.
