

PROVINCIAL EXECUTIVE

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. 1

Section 8: NOMINATION AND ELECTION OF PROVINCIAL EXECUTIVE OFFICERS

A. Each Provincial Officer of the Provincial Executive shall be elected by the members of the Provincial Association by referendum, the highest number of votes for each position to be sufficient to elect such officer. In the case where one person only is nominated for a certain position, her/his name shall go on the ballot with a 'yes' or 'no' beside it, a majority of 'yes' shall be necessary to elect such person. No member may be allowed to stand for election in more than one office on the referendum ballot.

(Note: the amendment is the addition of the words underlined above.)

PROVINCIAL EXECUTIVE

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. 2

Section 8: NOMINATION AND ELECTION OF PROVINCIAL EXECUTIVE OFFICERS

B. All candidates for positions as Provincial Officers must be nominated at a Convention. If a nominee is not present, her/his written consent must be given to the Secretary-Treasurer at the time of nomination. No member shall nominate more than one candidate for each office. Nomination for full-time paid positions will not be accepted by the Convention for any member completing her/his (second) term in a full-time paid position.

(Note: the amendment is the deletion of the bracketed word 'second'.)

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. 3

Section 14(C): CONVENTIONS

BE IT RESOLVED that Section 14(C) - Conventions - as it now reads:  
"C. Delegates:4. Members of the Provincial Executive shall automatically  
be delegates to conventions"  
be amended to add  
"in addition to the delegates elected by the Local Association as in  
Section 14C:1."

(Note: the relevant part of Section 14C:1 is: "Delegates shall be  
elected by Local Associations on the following basis: 1-50 members:  
2 delegates; 1 delegate for each additional 50 members or majority  
fraction thereof".)

Section 14(D): CONVENTIONS

BE IT RESOLVED that the part of Section 14(D) - Conventions -  
as it now reads:

"...Resolutions to the Provincial Annual Convention must be received  
by the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer at least fourteen (14) days  
prior to the convention date...."

be amended to read

"...Resolutions to the Provincial Annual Convention must be  
received at least twenty-eight (28) days prior to the convention  
date...".

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. 5

Section 13(C): PROVINCIAL COMMITTEES

BE IT RESOLVED that the Provincial Constitution be amended to change the Provincial Tabulating Committee to Trustees and that their duties shall include:

(a) checking of credentials at Provincial conventions and meetings;

(b) maintaining and updating the Provincial Constitution and Provincial Policies and Procedures manual;

and

(c) selecting one representative from among themselves who would serve on the Provincial Executive.

(Note: Section 13(C): Provincial Committees, now reads "There shall be a committee of three (3) known as the Tabulating Committee nominated and elected at the Annual Convention by secret ballot vote of those delegates present. The Committee shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson. It shall be the responsibility of the Tabulating Committee to conduct all voting for the Provincial Association including those votes at the Annual Convention, at Special Conventions and between conventions, and particularly referendum votes of the Provincial Association membership. The Tabulating Committee shall be responsible for checking the credentials of those entering the Provincial Association convention to ensure that those attending are delegates, members in good standing of the Provincial Association who are attending as observers, or invited guests.")

Section 13(C): PROVINCIAL COMMITTEES

BE IT RESOLVED that the Provincial Trustees be elected in the same manner as the Provincial President, Vice-President, Secretary-Treasurer and Union Organizer.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in the event that all the Provincial trustees resign, the Provincial Executive shall be empowered to appoint an elections committee.

(Note: The Provincial Association currently does not have trustees, it has a tabulating committee elected at the convention. The section of the Constitution referring to the Tabulating Committee is section 13(C)- Provincial Committees. The wording of this section is quoted under Constitutional Amendment No. 5 proposed for this Convention. If the position of Trustee is created at this Convention, the section of this proposed amendment referring to the method of election of trustees would be included under Section 8 - Nomination & Election of Provincial Executive Officers - of this Constitution.

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. 7

Section 2(A): OBJECTIVES

BE IT RESOLVED that Section 2(A) - Objectives - of the Provincial Constitution be amended to read:

"To bring about fair wage standards and to assure uniform job classification with equal pay for comparable work for all employees, regardless of sex, sexual preclivity, age, marital status, physical disability not affecting job performance, previous and current psychiatric or psychotherapeutic treatment not affecting job performance, skincolour, race, religious or political beliefs, national origin, or nature or number of dependents".

(Note: the proposed amendments to this section of the Constitution are underlined above. Section 2(A) of the Constitution now reads: "To bring about fair wage standards and to assure uniform job classification with equal pay for comparable work for all employees, regardless of sex, sexual orientation, age, marital status, color, race, religious or political beliefs, national origin, or whether or not she/he has children.")
